- Public Works has hired three new employees for laborer positions, and one sanitation driver this year and they have all been a great addition to the team.
- One of our new hires has gone though Chattanooga States CDL driving school and received his Class A CDL.
- The Public Works staff has received training from UTK TTAP program on work zone safety.
- Public Works has received title VI training.
- Staff Engineer Kris McAloon has been a great asset to Public Works with greenway project design and inspection, as well as ROW permitting.
- Jacky Jones retired, after 44 years of service to the City.
- Public Works Foreman and Director have attended TDEC Natural Disaster Workshop.

- This year the Sewer department has been focusing on completing sewer mainline cleaning/camera work and manhole lining. We have cleaned/TV - 7,945ft of basin 1, and have lined 117 manholes about 15% of all manholes.
- The Collegedale Sewer system did not experience any sanitary sewer overflows.
- The fleet maintenance department has been upfitting the police vehicles with after-market equipment, and keeping the Police and Public Works fleet maintained, however there is a need for an additional automotive technician.
- Public Works has purchased a commercial paint sprayer and has been completing exterior painting projects around the City, as well as pressure washing City Buildings and other City infrastructure.
- Public Works responded to our first the train derailment in the City, providing traffic control devices, and logistics assistance for FD, PD, and emergence spill response teams.
- Public Works completed its largest striping project to date, striping almost 10 miles of City streets with high visibility thermoplastic.
- Public Works completed one greenway extension project from the Veterans park parking to the greenway, and a sidewalk extension from Apison Pike up Little Debbie Parkway to both apartment complexes.
